DAL'S FIRST IN-PERSON MEETING WAS A SUCCESS!

The <u>Digital Action Lab</u> is at the heart of CIVICUS' efforts under DDI. The DAL is an innovation space that brings together civil society from around the world and, for nine months, empowers them with mentorship to build digital and core skills, financial resources and opportunities to experiment with digital tools and approaches, hone their advocacy skills and collaborate with international peers to amplify the voices of civil society reinforcing democracy and civic freedoms.

In March, the first group of DAL participants celebrated their first in-person meeting, where they got to know each other, presented their ideas for utilising technology to advance democracy in their communities. These ideas were further enriched by the knowledge and insights gained through training sessions and co-design workshops.

These nine organisations – from Colombia, Kenya, Kyrgyz Republic, Lebanon, Indonesia, Nepal, Nigeria, Venezuela and Zambia – were selected for their exceptional commitment to digital innovation for social improvement from a pool of around 1,500 applications. In the next quarterly newsletter, we'll be introducing these inspiring organisations and their project ideas. Stay tuned!

CO-DESIGNING SOLUTIONS TO PROMOTE INCLUSIVE DEMOCRACY

Another great development is that this year we kicked off a series of regional exploratory and co-design processes in seven regions around the world. These will help identify regional needs and opportunities to use digital technology for inclusive democracy and codesign new potential mechanisms to channel funding and non-financial resources (including mentorship, training and networking opportunities) for civil society. Our co-design sessions across the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) and Central Asia & Eastern Europe regions successfully convened stakeholders from over 22 countries, led by our partners Innovation for Change MENA Hub and Paperlab. Building on this momentum, we're thrilled to announce upcoming co-design meetings in Latin America and the Caribbean, South Asia, East Asia, Sub-Saharan Africa and Pacific regions which are planned for April, May and June of this year.

The testing and implementation of the codesigned regional support mechanisms for MENA and South Asia will launch later in 2024.
